THE HONOURABLE THE COLONIAL SECRETARY, (Acting).

I have the honour to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, the following report on the work of the Mines Department for the year ended 31st December, 1920.

Official Duties.

- 2. The amalgamation of the Crown_cLands and the Mines Departments, the details of which were published in Council Paper No. 3 of 1919, has not yet taken place. Mr. R. R. Thompson has been appointed to the post of Director of Lands and Mines by the Secretary of State, but up to the time of writing has not arrived in the Colony. As the newly appointed Director of Lands and Mines was due to leave Persia, where he held an important appointment with the Anglo-Persian Oil Company Ltd.; at the end of December last, his arrival in the Colony may be expected at a very early date. During the whole of the past year I have acted as Inspector of Mines in addition to performing the duties of my substantive post, viz., Deputy-Inspector of Mines.
- Mr. J de Nobriga, Chief Clerk, was seconded for service as Secretary of the Wag-Committee from the 19th December 1919 to 30th September 1920. Mr. de Nobriga also acted as Chief Clerk of the Public Works Department from 1st October to 30th November last. Mr. F. Delmas of the Audit Office acted as Chief Clerk until 11th July 1920 and Mr. W. H. Clark of this Department acted as Chief Clerk from 12th July to 30th November last. Mr. F. O. Rooks, 3rd Clerk, acted as 2nd Clerk in the Forest Department from 15th March to 29th August last, when I regret to say that the career of this promising young officer was terminated by his death. Mr. N. A. Brown acted as 2nd Clerk from 12th July to 30th November 1920.

Leave.

3. No leave was granted during the year.

Legislation.

4. The only legislation passed during the period under review, affecting this Department, was the Oil Pollution and Water Conservation Ordinance No 46 of 1920. This Ordinance was introduced owing to the fact that a number of Injunctions had been obtained by lower riparian owners against several of the Oil Companies for the pollution, and abstraction, of water from the water courses. Consequently it was found necessary to introduce and pass legislation designed to enable the Oil Companies to carry on their operations in certain cases by paying suitable compensation and providing an alternative water supply.

Work under the Mines, Borings and Quarries Ordinances.

5. Manjak. The Trinidad Tarouba Oil Development Company is the only Company which is operating in this industry. This Company continues to work the Vistabella Mine at San Fernando from which 134 tons of manjak were produced during the period under review.

Petroleum.

6. General Remarks. In my last report, I mentioned that there was great difficulty in obtaining delivery of drilling equipment and machinery. I am glad to report that during the past year the situation in this respect has materially improved and in consequence a number of new Oil Companies have been enabled to commence operations. Several Companies have started drilling in areas from which, up to the present, no oil has been extracted. If the wells, which at present are being drilled in these districts, are successful in obtaining oil in commercia quantities, the production of oil in the Colony should be very largely increased in the near future

The number of feet drilled in the Colony shows a considerable increase over that for the yea 1919. There is also, I am glad to be able to report, an increase in the quantity of oil produced as appears from the following paragraph, as compared with the preceding year. But wher compared with the year 1918, this increase is only very slight.

The export of crude oil and its products shows a substantial decrease during the past year, the figures being 36,000,000 Imperial Gallons as against 49,000,000 Imperial Gallons for 1919. These were, however, considerable stocks of oil still awaiting export at the close of the past year. Large shipments of oil fuel have been made to the Admiralty and constitute the largest par of the oil exported from the Colony; most of the lighter products are now exported to privat

firms During the early part of the year 1920, a considerable increase in the bunker trade was experienced; this increase was not sustained as towards the close of the past year, the demand for bunker oil materially declined.

7. The following table shows the number of feet drilled and the quantity of oil produced during the period under review, as compared with the years 1918 and 1919:—

During the year 1920 the number of new wells drilled was 67 (44 on Crown Lands and 23 on Private Lands), a total increase of 14 over the previous year. In 41 of these wells oil was struck. The total number of wells drilled in the Colony from the commencement of operations to 31st December last was 523, of which 313 were on Crowns Lands.

- 8. At the close of the year 1920, 22 Companies were engaged in the winning of oil as against 13 at the end of the year 1919.
- 9. The Trinidad Leaseholds Limited, in addition to continuing its operations on the Morne L'Enfer Forest Reserve and Barrackpore Fields during the past year, also continued drilling in the Piparo and Santa Cecilia districts. In both of the latter districts, however, operations were spended before the close of the year 1920. This Company has continued to obtain a large production from its fields at Morne L'Enfer Forest Reserve and Barrackpore, the whole of which has been treated at its Refinery at Pointe-à-Pierre. Large shipments of oil fuel have been exported to the Admiralty from the Company's shipping depôt at Pointe-à-Pierre, and in addition there has been a considerable shipment of oil fuel for bunker purposes. The Company's Refinery has been worked during the whole of the past year the products manufactured being Oil Fuel, Kerosene, White Oil and Petrol. Although work on the additions to the Refinery as mentioned in my last report has been continued during the whole of the year under review, these additions have not as yet been completed.
- 10. The Trinidad Lake Petroleum Company Limited did no drilling on its private lands at Brighton, but still continues to produce oil from wells previously drilled. This Company exported a considerable quantity of oil during the past year, which had been in stock for some time owing to the difficulty of obtaining shipment.
- 11. The Petroleum Development Company, Limited, has continued drilling on the lands held by it under lease on the Morne L'Enfer Forest Reserve. A very large increase in production on the part of this Company has resulted in the past year, as a number of the new wells drilled have proved exceedingly prolific.
- 12. The operations of the United British Oilfields of Trinidad, Limited, has been chiefly confined to the Parry area in the Morne L'Enfer Forest Reserve. A considerable amount of drilling has been done by this Company during the past year, as a consequence of which the area of the fields under operation has been greatly extended. The production of this Company has, s before, been pumped to Point Fortin and sold to its allied Company, the United British ineries, Limited, which refined the crude oil and marketed the products.
- 13. The United British West Indies Petroleum Syndicate, Limited closed down operations at Moruga at the end of 1919, but has continued drilling on the Los Bajos field. A moderate production is being obtained by this Company, from this latter field which is pumped to Point Fortin and sold to the United British Refineries, Limited.
- 14. The Trinidad Central Oilfields, Limited, has continued drilling operations on the Crown Lands held under lease by it at Tabaquite. The production found in this district as before, has been of a high grade oil. I regret, however, to have to report that the quantity produced during the past year has not been so great as during the year 1919.
- 15. The Perseverance Estate at Guapo, owned by Mr. C. C. Stollmeyer, has been purchased by the Kern Trinidad Oilfields, Limited, a subsidiary Company of the Kern River Oilfields of California, Limited. There has been a small production of oil from the estate during the past year, but the Company is now actively engaged in building roads and opening up this property with a view to subsequent drilling operations, a considerably increased production should result in the near future, as a consequence
- 16. No drilling was done by the Trinidad United Oilfields, Limited, on the Crown Lands held by this Company under Lease at Palo Seco. At the date of my report, however, a well is in process of being drilled but so far no oil has been struck.
- 17. The Oropuche Oilfields, Limited, continued drilling operations on its private lands which adjoin the property of the Trinidad Leaseholds, Limited, in the Morne L'Enfer Forest Reserve. Towards the close of the year 1920 a very largely increased production was obtained. The production of this Company has been sold to the Trinidad Leaseholds Limited.

- 18. The Fyzabad Oilfields of Trinidad, Limited, continued drilling operations on its private lands near San Francique Road during the early part of the past year. No oil, however, was obtained, and during the latter part of the year operations have been suspended.
- 19. The Transvaal and Rhodesian Estates, Limited, has transferred its properties to the Globe Oilfields, Limited, but this latter Company has not yet commenced drilling operations on the properties thus acquired.
- 20. The Anglo-Trinidad Oil Company, Limited, undertook drilling operations in the San Francique and Fyzabad districts, but was not successful in obtaining oil. Preparations are now being made by this Company to commence drilling in the Rio Claro area.
- 21. The Trinidad National Petroleum Company, Limited, drilled wells in the Poonah and Madingo Road districts. Accidents were met with in each of its wells before oil in commercial quantities was struck, and operations have now for some time been suspended.
- 22. Drilling on private lands in the Fyzabad district was commenced by the Trinidad Oil Producing and Refining Company, Limited. The Company obtained from this area a production of oil which has been sold to the Trinidad Leaseholds Limited.
- 23. The Apex (Trinidad) Oil Company, Limited, undertook drilling operations in the early part of the year on the Santa Maria Estate near Fyzabad. This Company has maintained a very active programme during the period under review, and oil has been struck in several of the wells. The resulting production has been sold by the Apex Company to the Trinidad Leaseholds Limited.
- 24. The Amalgamated Oilfields of Trinidad, Limited, is now engaged in drilling a well in the Moruga district, but up to the present no oil has been struck.
- 25. The Trinidad Freeholds, Limited, put in hand operations on private lands adjoining the area held under lease by the Trinidad Leaseholds, Limited, at Fyzabad. The resultant production has been sold to the Trinidad Leaseholds, Limited.
- 26. The Uroz Oilfields, Limited, (to whom a Prospecting Licence over some 1,500 acres of alienated lands on which the Crown holds the oil rights was issued) commenced work on its private lands in the Piparo district, At the time of my report, operations had also been commenced by this company in the Charuma district on the area held under Prospecting Licence.
- 27. During the past year, drilling operations have been commenced on private lands by the following Companies: —

British Controlled Oilfields, Limited.

Trinidad Esmeralda Estates, Limited.

Trinidad-Tarouba Oil Development Company.

General Petroleum Company of Trinidad, Limited,

but oil has not yet been produced by any of them in Commercial quantities.

28. The Royalty earned during the year amounted to £18,710. Of this, £18,609 accrued under leases and £101 under licences. The amount earned during the year 1919 was £17,205 which shows a total increase of £1,505 during the past year. The Revenue obtained from Wayleaves for oil piped along the Trinidad Government Railway and the Public Roads of the Colony, was as follows:—

- 29. Fees charged for crossing the foreshore, Railway and Roads with pipelines, amounted to £16.
- 30. The various Oil Companies have regularly submitted to the department the returns required to be furnished by them in respect to their operations. These, after being checked, have been filed with the office records of this Department.
- 31. Inspection. The work of the Inspecting Officers of the Department has considerably increased during the past year, owing to the number of new Companies which have started active operations. The various Oilfields have been regularily inspected and in addition a considerable number of special inspections arising out of accidents and in connection with Royalties, Wayleaves, etc., has been executed. In the majority of cases the provision of the Ordinances and Regulations relating thereto, have been carefully carried out. It has not been necessary to institute any prosecution for breaches of the law.
- 32. Leases and Licences. A Prospecting Licence over 1,507 acres of alienated lands, on which the Crown holds the oil rights, was issued to the Uroz Oilfields, Limited. A considerable number of applications for licences to Prospect for oil on lands over which the Government holds the oil rights has been received. These applications are under consideration.

- 33. QUARRIES. The remarks made in my last report for 1919 on this subject still hold good. With the exception of the Eastern and Carrera Quarries, both owned by the Government, the Quarries, at present being worked in the Colony are relatively unimportant. Regular inspections have been carried out, and, in most cases, it has been found that such quarries have been operated in a careful manner. During the year 1920 the number of quarries worked amounted to 62 as compared with 66 at the end of 1919.
- 34. Work under The Petroleum Ordinance No. 20 of 1915. The premises, in which the various products of Petroleum are stored, have been regularily inspected by the officers of this Department, and it has generally been found that the utmost care has been observed by the owners of such premises. It was necessary to institute one prosecution against a Garage Manager for storing Petrol without a licence.
- 35. PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS ORDINANCE No. 13 of 1915. I am pleased to be able to record that the owners and managers of the various factories co-operate with this Department in insuring safety to the workmen in their employment. In general, the machinery in the various factories, is most efficiently protected. In all, 83 factories in Trinidad and 12 in Tobago were worked during the past year. The total number of accidents was 8, only one of which proved fatal.

Work under the Asphalt Industry Ordinance.

- 36. Work has not been recommenced on the village lots at La Brea and I am not in a position to state when this industry is likely to be recommenced.
- 37. APPENDICES. Appendix A shews the average number of persons employed and the quantity and value of minerals obtained.

In Appendix B the list of accidents is given and indicates that they are such as are incidental to all industrial operations of this class.

In Appendix C is given a list of Mines, Oilfields and Quarries worked during the year 1920.

A comparative statement of oil produced, refined and exported is shewn at Appendix D.
